3. Read John 2:1-12, then read Amos 9:14. How does the first "sign" of Jesus point to God's promised future? Why might that make us (or the disciples) more willing to follow him?
4. Read Ephesians 5:25-27. Who is the "bride of Christ?" What does Jesus do for his Bride? How is this different from simply modifying our behavior?
5. A friend tells you that it's ok to follow Jesus "as long as you're not a fanatic about it." How might you use this week's lesson (and the examples of the first disciples) to answer them?

- Do you think it's possible to selectively follow Jesus (only believe what you want)? If Jesus was a real person, what did he come to do? Do you believe your children's future is secure?
