STUDY/DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What are some examples of the way our culture describes "the good life?" What sorts of images and words do our "shepherds" use?

3. Read John 10:1-10. How do we see Ezekiel's prophecy reflected in Jesus' teaching? (hint: who are the "thieves and robbers?")

4. What does Jesus say he came to offer his people? What does it mean to have "abundant life?"

5. Read John 10:11-21. How does Jesus set himself apart from other "shepherds?" What are some examples of "shepherds" in our day that demand that we follow them?

6. Christian discipleship demands that we distinguish Jesus' voice from all the other "shepherds" in our lives. What are some ways that Christians can learn to better recognize God's voice?
